

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE PALISADE BOARD OF TRUSTEES January 28, 2025

A work session of the Board of Trustees for the Town of Palisade began at 6:00 pm to discuss proposed domestic water rate increases. Present were Mayor Greg Mikolai, Mayor Pro-Tem Jamie Somerville, Trustees Stan Harbaugh, Jeff Snook, and Rick Fox. Also in attendance were Town Manager Janet Hawkinson, Town Clerk Keli Frasier, and Finance Director Gregg Mueller.

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees for the Town of Palisade was called to order at 7:40 pm by Mayor Greg Mikolai with Trustees present: Stan Harbaugh, Jeff Snook, Rick Fox, and Mayor Pro-Tem Jamie Somerville. Absent were Trustees Nicole Maxwell and Sarah Matchett. Also in attendance were Town Manager Janet Hawkinson, Town Clerk Keli Frasier, Parks, Facilities & Events Director Troy Ward, Public Works Director Brian Flenniken, Community Development Director Devan Aziz, and Finance Director Gregg Mueller.

AGENDA ADOPTION

Motion #1 by Mayor Pro-Tem Somerville, seconded by Trustee Snook, to approve the agenda as presented.

Dr. Nathan Perry presented the 2024 Economic Development Study report.

TOWN MANAGER REPORT

Town Manager Janet Hawkinson announced that the Town was awarded a \$3 Million grant for remediation of the sewer lagoons.

Town Manager Hawkinson then asked the Board if they were interested in entering an IGA with the Mesa County Fire Authority for administrative services to be provided by the Palisade Fire Chief.

The consensus of the Board is to move forward with Mayor Mikolai and Trustee Fox discussing terms of the IGA with the Mesa County Fire Authority Board.

PUBLIC HEARING I

Conditional Use Permit for Food Manufacturing in Light-Industrial (LI) Zone.

Mayor Mikolai opened the Public Hearing at 7:07 pm.

Community Development Director Aziz gave a brief presentation, including the findings of fact, to discuss a proposed Conditional Use Permit (CUP) to allow the processing of food and food-related products at 3810 North River Rd as applied for by Monumental Mushrooms.

Applicant Rhysa Ferris gave a presentation regarding why the proposed CUP is being requested and what kinds of products they grow and sell.

Mayor Mikolai opened the hearing to public comment.

Matt Payne of Palisade spoke in support of the application, stating that the proposed business will benefit all fruit growers in the Valley.

Mayor Mikolai opened the hearing to Board comment.

Members of the Board discussed the following items and concerns:

- Will the area support parking for potential retail
- Length of time the business plans to operate
- Time business has been in operation
- Residual impacts of the business

Motion #3 by Mayor Pro-Tem Somerville, seconded by Trustee Harbaugh, to approve a Conditional Use Permit for Monumental Mushrooms, located at 3810 North River Rd, to allow the processing of food and related products with conditions recommended by staff.
