

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE PALISADE BOARD OF TRUSTEES August 26, 2025

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees for the Town of Palisade was called to order at 6:00 pm by Mayor Greg Mikolai, with Trustees present: Nicole Maxwell, Stan Harbaugh, Jeff Snook, Rick Fox, Sarah Matchett, and Mayor Pro-Tem Jamie Somerville. A quorum was declared. Also in attendance were Town Manager Janet Hawkinson, Town Clerk Keli Frasier, Parks, Facilities & Events Director Troy Ward, Chief of Police Jesse Stanford, and Special Event Coordinator Rebecca Loucks.

AGENDA ADOPTION

NEW BUSINESS

RESOLUTION 2025-22: Federal Mineral Lease District (FMLD) Grant Application Support Requests for a Police Department K-9 Unit

Palisade Police Chief Jesse Stanford gave a presentation on the proposed K-9 program and requested Board support to apply for an FMLD grant to get the program started.

The Board of Trustees and Chief Stanford discussed the concept of the program, including the following topics:

- The annual cost to keep the program moving forward
- Projected veterinary costs
- The K-9 being a great ambassador for the community
- The need for a K-9 unit at the schools, at special events, and along I-70 (weapons, drugs, and explosives)
- The possibility of having a second handler for the K-9 in case of officer vacations or illness
- Once this K-9 retires, will the Police Department want to continue the program
- If the grant is awarded, can the final approval of the expenditure come back to the Board for final approval

Motion #3 by Mayor Pro-Tem Somerville, seconded by Trustee Harbaugh, to approve Resolution 2025-22 supporting a \$45,000 Mesa County Federal Mineral Lease District grant application for a K-9 Unit.

RESOLUTION 2025-23: Colorado Tourism Office (CTO) Grant Request

Town Manager Hawkinson introduced the Chair of the Tourism Advisory Board (TAB), Juliann Adams, who gave a presentation to the Board regarding the proposed use of the marketing funds if the grant is awarded.

The Board of Trustees and Chair Adams discussed the marketing concept, including the following topics:

- Partnership with Powderhorn Ski Resort
- Potential partnership with Cameo Sport Shooting Complex
- Off-season marketing needs

Motion #4 by Mayor Pro-Tem Somerville, seconded by Trustee Matchett, to approve directing the Mayor to sign a letter of commitment supporting the application for a CTO Grant for offseason regional marketing with a match of \$15,000 from the Tourism Budget, a \$5,000 contribution from Powderhorn, and \$40,000 from the CTO grant for a total project cost of \$60,000.

ORDINANCE 2025-08: Adoption of Building Codes 1st READING

- The use of "most current" vs. "2024" plans. There are different code years for various areas in the building code being adopted.
- Mesa County is the Town of Palisade's building inspectors

Motion #5 by Trustee Matchett, seconded by Trustee Harbaugh, to approve ORDINANCE 2025-08 on first reading and move the item forward to Public Hearing on September 9, 2025.

Trustee Snook summarized the most recent Tourism Advisory Board meeting; Mayor Pro-Tem Somerville gave a brief update on the Palisade Chamber of Commerce events, Mayor Mikolai updated the Board on the latest meeting with the Grand Valley Regional Transportation Committee (GVRTC), Trustee Harbaugh reviewed the meeting of the Associated Governments of Northwest Colorado (AGNC), Trustee Matchett discussed the Grand Junction Economic Partnership (GJEP), and Trustee Maxwell asked the Board if she could represent Palisade and speak with the Mesa County School District 51 Board regarding School Resource Officer (SRO) funding (consensus was yes).
