Comments from the Fire Chief

I remain grateful to the Town of Palisade for the opportunity to serve as the Fire Chief. The support I receive from the Town Administrator, Board of Trustees and fellow Directors is unlike any I have received from previous agencies.

Staffing continues to be of concern for the fire department. This is due to a variety of factors including personnel out on leave, and the loss of staff to other organizations. The current staff have done a tremendous job of trying to assist in covering shifts in addition to providing standby for the festivals. I am looking at a few alternative means of recruiting, but each time we post for a position three or more other agencies post vacancies as well and it is difficult to compete with their salaries.

Administrative Update

- Colorado State Chief's Association does not have much faith that the Colorado Legislature will come up reasonable solutions during the second Special Session in less than one year. The provisions from the last Special Session on property taxes had a significant negative impact on all Special Districts.
- Still waiting legal guidance on the potential fiscal impacts from the passage of Senate Bill 24-233. Again, this made changes to the residential assessment rates for property owners in Colorado. This effectively decreased the revenue collections with a projected impact to the non-school local governments in the amount of \$435.9 million.
- Working on fee schedule for billable services not related to fighting fire within the fire department/district boundaries.
- I will be sitting on a panel for the Colorado State Fire Chiefs to address the difficulties around recruitment and retention in the fire service.

Personnel Update

- Ryan Fairclough has resigned as a Lieutenant and Training Officer for Palisade Fire Department and accepted a Lieutenant position in Gypsum. I will be filling his shifts and role as Training Officer until other arrangements can be made.
- Charisse Swetnam has completed her Paramedic externship and is waiting to take the National Registry Exam. Once she has passed that she will begin protocolling with Lieutenant Josh Dittebrand for three months.

Training Update

- We hosted an all-day Extrication Training
- We have started the Mesa County School District 51 High School Fire Academy. Currently have 10 students.

Apparatus/Equipment Update

- I flew to Texas to do the inspection on the new brush truck. The vendor has done several upgrades at no cost to us. The delivery is estimated to be the end of August.
- We will be restoring the old Hose Cart and placing it outside in corner by the radio tower.


Miscellaneous

• We had a busy time at this year's Peach Festival with 8 calls specifically tied to the events over the course of 8/16-8/17. Two were calls within the Town for intoxication and/or fainting.

Operations

For the month of July 2024, the Palisade Fire Department responded to 97 calls. This is a decrease of 11 calls compared to this time last year. For the 2024 year to date we received 576 calls for service which is a decrease 55 calls from 2023.




<u>Calls for Service to Date</u>

SUBJECT:

Resolution 2024-20: Ballot Language for Increase to Sales Tax

SUMMARY:

The Palisade Board of Trustees approved an Internal Governmental Agreement (IGA) with Mesa County Elections Department to coordinate a mail ballot election on November 5, 2024, to ask the voters of Palisade to increase the sales tax currently imposed in the Town of Palisade.

At a work session of the Board of Trustees on July 9, 2024, staff was directed to move forward with preparing the necessary paperwork to coordinate with Mesa County on the November 5, 2024 election to ask the voters of the Town of Palisade to pass an increase of sales tax from 2% to 4%, with the additional revenues to be used for capital infrastructure projects and emergency services.

Town Attorney Jim Neu drafted the attached Resolution and proposed ballot language based upon the Board of Trustees's recommendation. TABOR (Tax Payors Bill of Rights) has very specific requirements for ballot language and how ballot questions are written. The bulk of the language cannot be changed. What the Board CAN consider amending is the amount of increase, and allocation of the revenues.

TOWN OF PALISADE, COLORADO RESOLUTION NO. 2024-20

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF PALISADE, COLORADO, SUBMITTING A BALLOT ISSUE TO THE REGISTERED ELECTORS OF THE TOWN OF PALISADE, COLORADO, AT THE GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 5, 2024, CONCERNING WHETHER THE TOWN OF PALISADE SHOULD INCREASE THE SALES TAX IMPOSED BY THE TOWN ON ALL SALES OF TANGIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY AND ON THE FURNISHING OF TAXABLE SERVICES FROM 2.0% TO 4.0% WITH THE ADDITIONAL REVENUES FROM THE 2.0% INCREASE IN SALES TAX COLLECTED TO BE USED TO FUND CAPITAL PROJECTS AND EMERGENCY SERVICES.

WHEREAS, the Town of Palisade, Colorado ("Town") is a municipal corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Colorado; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Palisade Municipal Code Section 4-59, there is imposed on all sales of tangible personal property and on the furnishing of taxable services a tax equal to 2.0% of the gross receipts within the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Town has not increased the sales tax imposed within the Town for decades and the rate of 2.0% imposed is more than half of what is imposed in neighboring jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees desires to submit to the registered voters of the Town of Palisade the question of whether to increase the sales tax imposed by the Town from 2.0% to 4.0% with the additional revenues from the 2.0% increase in sales tax collected to be used to fund capital projects and emergency services (the "Ballot Question"), which question will be submitted to the registered voters at the general election to be held on November 5, 2024.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF PALISADE, COLORADO, THAT:

<u>Section 1.</u> <u>Submission to Voters</u>. There shall be submitted to the eligible electors of the Town at the general election held on November 5, 2024, a question authorizing the increase in the sales tax imposed by the Town on all sales of tangible personal property an on the furnishing of taxable services, which question shall be in substantially the form attached to and incorporated into this resolution as Exhibit A.

<u>Section 2</u>. <u>Implementation of the Increased Sales Tax</u>. If a majority of the votes cast on the Ballot Question submitted at the election are in favor of such question, the Board of Trustees shall be authorized to proceed with the necessary action to increase the sales tax imposed by the Town in accordance with such question. Any authority to increase the sales tax, if conferred by the results of the election, shall be deemed and considered a continuing authority to increase the Town of Palisade, Colorado Resolution No. of 2024-20 Page 2 of 3

sales tax so authorized at any one time, or from time to time, and neither the partial exercise of the authority so conferred, nor any lapse of time, shall be considered as exhausting or limiting the full authority so conferred.

<u>Section 3.</u> <u>Effective Date</u>. Subject to voter approval of the Ballot Question at the November 5, 2024 general election, the increase in the sales tax shall commence on or after January 1, 2025.

<u>Section 4</u>. <u>TABOR Notice</u>. At least thirty (30) days prior to the election, on or before October 4, 2024, the Town Clerk shall mail at the least cost, a titled notice or set of notices addressed to "All Registered Voters" at each address of one or more active registered voters concerning the ballot question referenced in this resolution. The notice shall be entitled "**NOTICE OF ELECTION TO INCREASE TAXES.**" The notice shall also include all information required by Article X, Section 20(3)(b) ("The Taxpayer's Bill of Rights").

<u>Section 5.</u> <u>Effect of Election Results</u>. If a majority of the votes cast on the Ballot Question submitted at the election shall be in favor of the ballot issue, the Board of Trustees shall take such action, by ordinance, to amend the Palisade Municipal Code to incorporate the Ballot Question so approved consistent with the terms and provisions of the Ballot Question and this resolution.

<u>Section 6.</u> All actions heretofore taken (not inconsistent with the provisions of this resolution) by the Town and officers thereof, directed toward the election and the objects and purposes herein stated are hereby ratified, approved, and confirmed.

Section 7. The officers and employees of the Town are hereby authorized and directed to take all other actions necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of this resolution.

Palisade Pet Care LLC is looking to partner with the Town of Palisade to establish a feral cat sterilization program. The goal of this program would be to sterilize "100 cats in thirty days" for the month of September. Palisade Pet Care is seeking financial aid from the Town of Palisade to help offset the cost of traps, cardboard carries, and the pharmaceuticals used in the sterilization procedure, Dr. Julie Page will be providing her services at no charge. The cost to sterilize 100 feral cats is approximately \$15,700 with the potential to prevent the birth of over 900 kittens in the first year alone. Palisade Pet Care LLC hopes that the Town of Palisade understands the communities need to manage the current feral cat population and will consider partnering with a local business such as ours to not only prevent the current population from growing exponentially but to help protect the health of the beloved pets of all Palisade residents.
