Wastewater Consolidation to Clifton

\$24 million

- DOLA Grant Engineering Wastewater Consolidation \$1 million
- Phase of Project: Easement & Engineering
- The Town is completing the engineering and land acquisition phase.
- The project is still meeting the timeline with the RFP for construction to be posted in late summer.

Pretreatment Wastewater Program Implementation

- The Town is focusing on the pretreatment wastewater program. This has been a multi-year project. Pretreatment means tanks must be added to the sewer systems to trap waste that is not wanted in collection pipes or wastewater treatment plants.
- The Town has had pretreatment requirements that have never been enforced.
- There are over 100 businesses in Town that have been or need to be inspected to determine pretreatment requirements.
- Pretreatment needs to occur. It must happen for collections in pipes and the lagoons whether the Town consolidates with Clifton or not. Businesses should have been in compliance over 20 years ago.
- Surveys and letters have been sent. New letters will be sent.

Roundabout Highway 6 – CDOT

Comments from the Fire Chief

The fire service continues to wait to see what the federal government is going to do with any funding to include grants such as AFG. I continue to remain optimistic that funding will resume for such programs.

The Palisade Fire Department entered into a MOU with Mesa County Fire Authority effective March 26, 2025. Under the current agreement, there will be phases in which I will be spending time assessing the performance capabilities of the organization, conducting a records review, assessing apparatus and equipment and evaluating their training program. Phase one is a ninety-day period of evaluation and at the end I will make recommendations to their Board of Directors. They will be reimbursing the Town for my time and any expenses incurred.

With the changes in legislation governing ambulance licensing, we will need to set our own ambulance billing rate at that is no longer set by the County. I will be discussing this with the other Mesa County agencies to get an idea of what the overall thoughts are for billing rates.

Administrative Update

- On April 16th, I attended a presentation put on by the BLS for all Mesa County Cooperators on coordination of resources, communications and operations during wildland responses
- On April 25th conducted an ADU inspection for driveway access at 3513 G. Road.
- All VHF radios have been updated with the current regional frequencies.
- Continue attending Colorado State Fire Chief's Legislation calls. There continues to be uncertainty with state level funding and proposals of new restrictions being proposed for Special Districts.
- Attended the PHS Senior Awards night and presented the Fire Academy Seniors with certificates of completion for EMR, Firefighter I and Hazardous Materials.
- We had a great turnout for the ceremonial apparatus push in of Brush 42.
- On May 6th had a follow meeting with Clifton Fire representatives to discuss the use of mutual aid and the
 improvements we have made which significantly reduced the need for their assistance outside of second or
 third calls.

Training Update

- The D51 High School Academy has finished their year. We finished with 9 out of 10 students. The successful completed all required course testing and State certification skills testing. Several are interested in taking the State written for State certification.
- We are hosting the States' Hazmat Training Trailer and will be hosting the State's Live Fire Training Trailer. We will coordinate with local agencies on training with each.
- Dominique Johnson has completed the didactic requirements for the Paramedic Program and will be starting his externship with Grand Junction Fire and Lower Valley Fire.
- Sent two people to Peer Support Training

Apparatus/Equipment Update


• We have slowly been receiving personal protective equipment associated with both the DFPC Firefighter Health and Safety Grant and the FEMA SAFER Grant. Once all items have been received, it will be issued to the current probationary members and request for reimbursement will be sent.

• We have started the process of recruiting for the 2025/2026 High School Academy. We are partnering with the Mesa County Workforce Center to aid in funding for the program.


Operations




Monthly Call Breakdown

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF PALISADE DELEGATING THE MAYOR AND TOWN MANAGER THE AUTHORITY TO SIGN MEMORANDA OF AGREEMENT, DEEDS, CLOSING DOCUMENTS AND TAKE ANY OTHER ACTIONS NECESSARY FOR THE ACQUISITION OF PALISADE SEWER TRANSFER PROJECT PARCELS NUMBER 21 AND 22.

- WHEREAS, the Town of Palisade ("Palisade" or the "Town") is a statutory town organized pursuant to C.R.S. §31-1-203 and with the authority of the Municipal Code of the Town of Palisade (the "Code"); and
- **WHEREAS**, the Palisade to Clifton Sewer Transfer Project ("Project") is a necessary sewer connection between the Town and Clifton Sanitation District's Wastewater Treatment Plant; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Town requires property acquisition including fee simple parcels, temporary easements, and permanent easements for the installation of the wastewater service pipelines; and
- **WHEREAS**, by Resolution No. 9, Series 2025 the Board authorized property acquisitions up to \$50,000.00 in value; and
- **WHEREAS**, Town staff has negotiated an agreement with the owner of the property identified as Mesa County Assessor Number 2941-053-00-124 for the acquisition of Project Parcel Number 21 ("Parcel 21"), to acquire the necessary property interests; and
- **WHEREAS**, Town staff has negotiated an agreement with the owner of the property identified as Mesa County Assessor Number 2941-053-00-049 for the acquisition of Project Parcel Number 22 ("Parcel 22"), to acquire the necessary property interests; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Board finds it is in the best interest of the health, welfare, and safety of citizens of the Town to authorize the Mayor and Town Manager to sign Memoranda of Agreements, Deeds, Closing Documents, and take all necessary actions to consummate the foregoing real property transaction.

NOW, THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF PALISADE, COLORADO, THAT:

- **Section 1**. The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein as if set forth in full.
- <u>Section 2.</u> The Board of Trustees authorizes the Mayor and Town Manager to sign Memoranda of Agreements, Deeds, Closing Documents, and take all necessary actions to

consummate the necessary real property transaction for Parcel 21 for up to Fifty-Five Thousand Five Hundred Nineteen Dollars (\$55,519.00) in value to prosecute the Project.

The Board of Trustees authorizes the Mayor and Town Manager to sign Memoranda of Agreements, Deeds, Closing Documents, and take all necessary actions to consummate the necessary real property transaction for Parcel 22 for up to One Hundred Thirty-Two Thousand Two Hundred Thirty-Four Dollars (\$132,234.00) in value to prosecute the Project.
